4.1 TRANSPORT CHOICES CYCLEWAY PROJECT (LANSDOWNE AND KURIPUNI) - EASTSIDE LINK CYCLEWAY - HEARING

#### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this report is to provide Council with the submissions on the Transport Choices Cycleway Project (Lansdowne and Kuripuni) Consultation ahead of the hearings for those submitters who wished to present their submissions orally. The procedure for the hearing is also provided.

Hearings will commence at 1pm on Wednesday 2 August 2023.

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

That Council:

- 1. **receives** the full set of submissions on the Transport Choices Cycleway Project (Lansdowne and Kuripuni) (Attachment 1);
  - (a) **notes** that 187 submissions were received;
  - (b) **notes** of these submissions [TBC] are confirmed to be heard.
- 2. **notes** that an Extraordinary Council meeting has been scheduled for 9 August 2023 at 9.00am for Council to deliberate on the proposed route to progress to final design.

#### **CONTEXT**

Council adopted the Transport Choices Cycleway Project (Lansdowne and Kuripuni) Consultation Document for consultation on 17 May 2023.

It was not originally planned to undertake a hearing following the consultation, however, a number of submitters have requested to speak to Council on the project so, to provide the opportunity to all those who submitted to present to Council, a hearing has been scheduled.

A schedule of those who wish to speak to Council will be provided as soon as it is available.

#### **CONSULTATION PROCESS**

Consultation on the Transport Choices Cycleway Project (Lansdowne and Kuripuni) Project occurred between 29 May 2023 and 16 June 2023.

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The consultation document and submission form were available on our website, from the Customer Services Centre (161 Queen Street) and the Library. Copies of the consultation document and submission form were also delivered to all mailboxes on the following streets:

- Colombo Road between the Masterton Netball Courts and Kuripuni Street
- Herbert Street (the entire length)
- Kuripuni Street (the entire length)
- Mākoura Road (the entire length)
- Johnstone Street between Colombo Road and Mākoura Road

The opportunity to submit was advertised to our community via direct emails to key stakeholders and community groups and through social media.

Elected Members and Council staff attended two sessions where people could provide their views and ask questions:

- Chanel College on Thursday 8 June from 5-7pm; and
- Masterton Netball Courts, Colombo Road on Saturday 10 June from 10am-12 noon.

Visits were made to Te Kura Kaupapa Māori o Wairarapa, Mākoura College and Puawānanga Wairarapa Young Parents and Chanel College. Council officers also attended a meeting of the Lakeview School Board of Trustees.

All business on the route were visited, with consultation documents provided for the businesses and customers. Ongoing contact took place with Eastside Superstore, with several follow-up visits to provide additional consultation documents.

Discussions with Netball Wairarapa were held to discuss safety concerns outside the Netball Courts at busy times to inform the next stage of design.

Emails encouraging submissions were sent, with follow-up phone calls, to Chanel College, Masterton Primary School and Masterton Intermediate School.

Contact was made with Fire and Emergency New Zealand and Wellington Free Ambulance to discuss any potential impacts on their operations. To date, none have been identified.

#### **SUBMISSIONS**

Full sets of all submissions received are available under separate cover and are also available on our website. See Attachment 1 (Volumes 1 and 2) for all the submissions received.

A total of 187 submissions were received.

Of the 187 submissions received, 60 submissions were made online, using the online platform (SurveyMonkey). 119 were completed on the physical submission form. Eight provided their submission via email or letter.

#### **HEARING PROCEDURE**

The hearing procedure is attached for reference (Attachment 2). Submitters will be heard in person or via Teams.

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#### **DELIBERATIONS**

Analysis of the submissions and trends will be presented to Council as part of the deliberations report for the Transport Choices Cycleway Project (Lansdowne and Kuripuni). This report will include advice from staff regarding the submissions received.

Council will discuss the submissions received, submission analysis and proposed recommendations; consider the views of the community and advice from staff; and make decisions at the Deliberations meeting scheduled for Wednesday 9 August 2023.

#### **NEXT STEPS**

Following this Hearing, a Deliberations meeting will take place on 9 August 2023 where Council will decide on the final route to be taken forward for detailed design.

The final detailed design will be submitted to Council for adoption in September 2023.

#### SUPPORTING INFORMATION

#### Strategic, Policy and Legislative Implications

Section 82 of the Local Government Act 2002 (LGA) sets out principles of consultation which must be met when undertaking consultation.

#### Significance, Engagement and Consultation

Under the Council's Significance and Engagement Policy, the decision to construct a cycleway is considered significant as there are residents, businesses, organisations and schools that are affected and/or that will have an interest; level of wider community interest; and the roading network being a strategic asset.

#### **Financial Considerations**

There are no specific financial considerations associated with the receipt or hearing of submissions.

#### **Treaty Considerations/Implications for Māori**

There are no specific implications for Māori arising from the receipt or hearing of submissions. Analysis of submitter demographics will be included in the deliberations report.

Following the deliberations meeting, Council decisions on the Transport Choices project will be communicated to submitters and the community.
