PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to provide the Awards and Grants Committee with the summarised grant applications received, applying for funding from the Community Wellbeing Grant and Community Events Fund. This is to allow for decisions to be made on the allocation of funding from the 2021/22 budgets. These are detailed in Attachments 1 and 2.

Also provided are Schedules 1, 2 and 3 listing the applications that will be presented to the Committee, those that will not, and those that were to be assessed by community development staff, under delegation.

Council provided funding to both funds, in the 2021–2031 Long Term Plan. These funds are available for allocation by the Awards and Grants Committee, who have delegated to community development staff decision making for grant applications, for \$6,000 and under up to 50% of the total Community Wellbeing Grant and \$3,000 and under for up to 50% of the Community Events Fund.

This report also supports the applications received, for the Awards and Grants Committee consideration for allocation of any funding for the \$6,001 and over Community Wellbeing Grant applications, and \$3,001 and over Community Events Fund applications.

CONTEXT

Community Wellbeing Grant

This funding is available to provide support to community groups and organisations for projects that contribute to the social, cultural, environmental, and economic wellbeing of our community, in alignment with our My Masterton: Our People, Our Land Wellbeing Strategy *He Hiringa Tangata*, *He Hiringa Whenua*.

The outcomes are:

- An engaged and empowered community
- Pride in our identity and heritage
- A sustainable and healthy environment
- A thriving and resilient economy
- Efficient and effective infrastructure

Applicants were required to identify the wellbeing area that their project would contribute to, and these are as follows:

The fund was adapted last year to help meet the increased needs and demands because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Community Events Fund

This funding is available to support the diverse and exciting events that appeal to residents, contribute to the priorities identified in our Wellbeing Strategy and celebrate our culturally rich, diverse district and region.

The fund was adapted last year as Council recognised that COVID-19 can impact on holding large scale events and there may be a growing need for grass-roots community events.

Therefore, applications are also accepted from individuals as well as community groups, associations, and clubs, that help grow and enhance our sense of community and increase opportunities, to engage and connect with each other safely.

The fund goals are:

- to optimise the economic contribution of events to Masterton
- to support events to be of a high quality
- to support events to grow and appeal to a wider audience
- to promote Masterton as an event visitor destination
- to create a positive image of Masterton to residents and visitors.

There are two key outcomes that link to our strategy:

- A Thriving and Resilient Economy; local events can attract visitors to Masterton that in turn provide economic benefits to the community
- An Engaged and Empowered Community; events provide opportunities for our community to connect and engage with each other

Some events may also support a third outcome:

• *Pride in our identity and heritage*; events an provide opportunities to celebrate and promote our cultural heritage and identity.

Applicants were required to identify the wellbeing area and the event category, that their project would contribute to.

DISCUSSION

Community Wellbeing Grant

The Community Wellbeing Grant opened on 1 July and closed 30 July 2021. The total funding that has been requested is \$336,214. Last year \$512,702 total funding was requested over two rounds.

Appended to this report are the following:

- Attachment 1 report table summarising the 39 applications for the information of the Committee. Last year 57 applications were received.
- **Schedule 1** briefly summarises 14 applications requesting a grant for \$6,001 and over that will be spoken to at this meeting. It also includes three applications for less than this amount, that have asked to speak in support of their application.

The Acting Manager Community Facilities and Activities, Grants Administrator, Event Coordinator/Community Development Support and Policy Manager have met and discussed these applications and based on their knowledge have provided a suggested grant, with comment in *Attachment 1* for the Committee.

- Schedule 2 briefly summarises an application that requested a grant for \$6,001 and over, however indicated they did not wish to speak in support. This is to be considered by the Committee.
- **Schedule 3** briefly summarises the 21 applications that requested a grant for \$6,000 and under, that were to be assessed by staff, under delegation and for no more than 50% of the budget allocated.

Grants totaling \$42,000 were allocated to 19 applicants and two applications were declined. All applicants were notified on these outcomes within ten working days.

The balance of funding is \$83,500 for the Committee's allocation to the 18 remaining applications.

Community Events Fund

The Community Events Fund opened on 1 July and closed 30 July 2021. The total funding requested was \$171,835 for events. Last year \$99,517 was requested.

Appended to this report are the following:

- **Attachment 2** report table summarizing the **19** applications for the information of the Committee. This is the same number of applications as last year.
- **Schedule 1** briefly summarises the nine applications requesting a grant for \$3,001 and over, that will be spoken to at this meeting to be considered by the Committee for a funding allocation.

The Acting Manager Community Facilities and Activities, Grants Administrator, Event Coordinator/Community Development Support and Policy Manager have met and discussed these applications and based on their knowledge, have provided a suggested grant, with comment in *Attachment 2* for the Committee.

- **Schedule 2** does not contain any Community Events Fund applications for \$3,001 and over, that did not wish to speak.
- **Schedule 3** briefly summarises the **10** applications that requested a grant for \$3,000 and under, that were to be assessed by staff, under delegation and for no more than 50% of the budget allocated.

Grants totalling **\$15,185** were allocated to the 10 applicants with no applications declined.

The balance of funding is \$66,815 for the Committee's allocation to the eight remaining applications.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

Strategic, Policy and Legislative Implications

The continued funding provision of the Community Wellbeing Grant and Community Events Fund to the community, supports Council's committment to the Wellbeing Strategy *He Hiringa Tangata, He Hiringa Whenua* and Council's community outcomes as specified in the 2022-28 Long-Term Plan. Aspects of both funds also align with Council's Arts, Culture and Heritage Strategy adopted on 26 June 2019.

Significance, Engagement and Consultation

The Community Wellbeing Grant and a Community Events Fund are not significant under the Significance and Engagement Policy because the decisions:

- do not relate to a strategic asset
- do not involve a change in level of service provided by council
- there is unlikely to be a high level of community interest in the decision
- the decision does not impact on debt, rates, or the financial figures in the Long-Term Plan
- it does not involve council exiting an existing activity or adding a new activity.

Financial Considerations

There are no significant considerations as the Community Wellbeing Grant and Community Events Fund are budgeted in the 2021-2031 Long Term Plan, as follows:

Community Wellbeing Grant

The budget for 2021/22 was set at \$80,000 for the contestable community wellbeing funding. An additional \$8,000 has been added as a carried forward budget from 2020/21 and \$37,500 for the organisations that did not apply to the Long-Term Plan process as expected and have applied here.

The total available for allocation for community wellbeing grants is \$125,500.

Community Events Fund

The budget for 2021/22 was set at \$80,000 for community event funding. An additional \$10,000 has been added as a carried forward budget from 2020/21. For any events to be held at Hood Aerodrome and for street closures for council events, \$8,000 has been set aside.

Separately budgeted is \$10,000 for Matariki 2022 and \$46,500 for the Waifest event to be held on Waitangi Day, 6 February 2022.

The total available for allocation for event funding is \$82,000.

Treaty Considerations/Implications for Māori

There is no significant impact on Māori and the grants and application process has provided a simplified and more agile process which may help to mitigate barriers to accessing funding and support, and thus empower Maori communities to demonstrate their rangatiratanga to implement cuturally appropriate repsonses.

Communications/Engagement Plan

A variety of channels were used e.g. social and traditional media to promote the Community Wellbeing Grant and the Community Events Fund. Application forms and the criteria information were accessible on the website and from Council's Queen Street office. Last year's recipients were contacted and provided an application form and information to apply. They were recontacted a week out from the closing date if an application had not been received.

Environmental/Climate Change Impact and Considerations

There will be continuing effects by COVID-19 to applicants applying for funding for projects and events as we move up and down Alert Levels. All grants allocated are subject to the COVID-19 Alert Levels and the restrictions these levels may pose. Staff advise applicants, when notifying them of the funding outcome, that funding may need to be repaid in full or part depending on the Alert Level restrictions at the time of the project or event taking place.

Next Steps

Considerations and funding decisions by the Awards and Grants Committe, at this meeting, for the Community Wellbeing Grant applications of \$6,001 and over and the Community Events Fund applications for \$3,001 and over, from the respective budgets, as listed in Attachments 1 and 2.

Applicants to then be advised as soon as possible after the meeting decisions, on the outcome of their application.

Applicants who applied for a Community Wellbeing Grant of \$6,000 and under, and for a Community Events Fund of \$3,000 and under, were advised on the outcome of their application, within 10 days of the closing date 30 July 2021.
